Media Synopsis:

On February 18, 2013, police responded to the couple's residence in Richmond Heights and found that their 12-year-old adopted daughter was not breathing. EMS arrived and found the child to be unresponsive to treatment. She was transported to University Hospital Richmond Medical Center where she was later pronounced dead. Medical personnel observed that both of the girl's feet were heavily bandaged and when her feet were unwrapped, they discovered that both feet had extensive wounds which had become necrotic and had a smell that indicated signs of decay.

The Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office performed an autopsy and determined that the victim had died from acute pneumonia onset from an untreated wound, causing an infection in her left leg and that eventually spread to her lung. The death was ruled a homicide due to lack of appropriate medical treatment given to the child.

On November 27, 2013, a Cuyahoga County Grand Jury charged Randy Jones, 41 at the time of the incident and Carissa Jones, 44 at the time of the incident, with involuntary manslaughter, endangering children, and permitting child abuse relating to the death of their daughter.

On May 18, 2015, a jury found both defendants guilty of one count of Involuntary Manslaughter, two counts of Endangering Children, and one count of Permitting Child Abuse.

Sentencing is scheduled to begin at 1:30 p.m.

During an argument at a local bar, Hampton, 28, of South Euclid, struck the victim one time in the head causing a hematoma which caused the victim's death.

On March 25, 2015, Hampton was found guilty by a jury of one count each of Murder, Felonious Assault, Involuntary Manslaughter and Assault. Sentencing is scheduled to begin at 2:30 p.m.
