### Primary Charges

#### **Media Synopsis:**

The Grand Jury charged Madison, then 35, with two counts each of Aggravated Murder in the deaths of Shetisha Sheeley, Angela H. Deskins and Shirellda Terry. The 14-count indictment also included three counts of Kidnapping, three counts of Gross Abuse of a Corpse, one count of Rape and one count of Having Weapons Under Disability.

In a separate case, Madison was also charged with a single felony count of Failure to Provide Notice of Change of Address. As a convicted sex offender who plead guilty in 2002 to Attempted Rape, Madison was required by law to tell the Cuyahoga County Sheriff where he was living and if he moved. Though listed in the sex offender registry as residing with his mother in Cleveland, Madison has in fact been living in East Cleveland.

Police found the first of the victims on July 19, 2013 after answering a complaint about odors coming from an East Cleveland garage. Two more bodies were discovered the following day. All three were wrapped in plastic bags. On that same day, Madison was arrested at his mother's home after a two-hour standoff with police.

Jury selection begins at 9:00 a.m.

#### **Media Synopsis:**

On November 18, 2015, Gilgallon, 37, of Lakewood, took his fiancé's 8-year-old daughter with him to purchase heroin, which he then gave to his fiancé, who ultimately overdosed next to her child. Gilgallon hid evidence of the heroin usage prior to the arrival of police and paramedics, who were able to save the woman's life. Drug paraphernalia was recovered on scene.

On March 23, 2015, Gilgallon entered a plea of guilty to one count each of Attempted Corrupting Another With Drugs, Drug Possession, Tampering with Evidence and Endangering Children.

Sentencing is scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m.

**Media Synopsis:**  
Tate, of Cleveland, was working at a daycare center on Cedar Avenue when she disciplined a child by hitting him 20-30 times on the leg, leaving welts and bruises. Ms. Tate was immediately fired.  
On March 7, 2016, Tate, 50, entered a plea of guilty to one count of Endangering Children. Sentencing is scheduled to begin at 8:00 a.m.

**Media Synopsis:**

Galarza hired Camacho to enter and set a fire in an occupied two-family structure at 3857 West 33rd Street in Cleveland on February 10, 2015. Camacho in turn hired Cruz-Figueroa, then 44, of Cleveland to assist him in setting the fire. The fire spread to two occupied structures on West 33rd Street resulting in severe damage to all three and necessitating the demolition of two of the three affected homes.

One of the occupants barely escaped; she subsequently spent nearly a year recovering from the injuries resulting from smoke inhalation and has permanent injuries.

On November 30, 2015, Camacho, 55, of Cleveland, entered a plea of guilty to three counts of Aggravated Arson, and one count each of Felonious Assault and Tampering With Evidence. He was sentenced to ten years in prison.

On March 22, 2016, Cruz-Figueroa entered a plea of guilty to one count each of Burglary, Arson, Felonious Assault, Aggravated Arson and Tampering with Evidence. Sentencing is scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m.

Galarza, 45, of Cleveland, is awaiting trial.
