Media Synopsis:

On September 5, 2015, Parr, 27, of Cleveland – who has been convicted multiple violent offenses including domestic violence, and felonious assault – shot into a vehicle that was occupied by a female and male. The female was struck in the arm and treated and released from a hospital; the male, however, underwent multiple surgeries as a result of being shot in the abdomen. The male victim identified Parr as the shooter. Parr and the male victim were both romantically involved with the same woman (but not the female who was shot).

In a separate case (599760-A) defendant is charged with Domestic Violence and theft.

Trial for both cases is scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m.

Camacho, Ismael | Galarza, Irving | Cruz-Figueroa, Luis

Media Synopsis:

Galarza, 44, of Cleveland, hired Camacho, 54, of Cleveland to enter and set a fire in an occupied two-family structure at 3857 West 33rd Street in Cleveland on February 10, 2015. Camacho in turn hired Cruz-Figueroa, 44, of Cleveland to assist him in setting the fire. The fire spread to two occupied structures on West 33rd Street resulting in severe damage to all three and necessitating the demolition of two of the three affected homes.

One of the occupants barely escaped; she subsequently spent nearly a year recovering from the injuries resulting from smoke inhalation and has permanent injuries.

On November 30, 2015, Camacho entered a plea of guilty to three counts of Aggravated Arson, and one count each of Felonious Assault and Tampering With Evidence. He was sentenced to ten years in prison.

On March 22, 2016, Cruz-Figueroa entered a plea of guilty to one count each of Burglary, Arson, Felonious Assault, Aggravated Arson and Tampering with Evidence. He was sentenced to five years in prison.

Trial for Galaraza is scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m.

Media Synopsis:

In December 2015, Mullins, 33, was responsible for babysitting the 2-year old victim while victim's mother was at work. On this occasion Mullins asked if the victim could stay for seven days because a young family member was going to be visiting and the children could play. Victim's mother agreed. When she picked up the child she found bruises, missing hair, and 2nd degree burns on the victim's buttocks. The child was taken to the hospital and confined to MetroHealth Medical Center for seven days due to the injuries. Mullins had babysat the victim for approximately 3 months.

On June 27, 2015, Mullins entered a plea of guilty to Endangering Children and Felonious Assault.

Sentencing is scheduled at 10:00 a.m.
